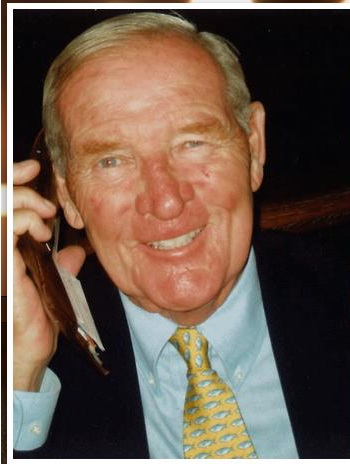


# Patrick H. Horgan II
